FOR PREVENTIVE CARE**

**Here are just a few of the preventive services
for women like you with no co-pay:**

- **Breast Cancer Mammography** screenings every 1 to 2 years for women over 40
- **Breastfeeding** comprehensive support and counseling from trained providers, as well as access to breastfeeding supplies, for pregnant and nursing women*
- **Cervical Cancer** screening for sexually active women
- **Contraception:** Food and Drug Administration-approved contraceptive methods, as well as patient education and counseling, not including abortifacient drugs*
- **Domestic and Interpersonal Violence** screening and counseling for all women*
- **Gestational Diabetes** screening for women 24 to 28 weeks pregnant and those at high risk of developing gestational diabetes*
- **Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV)** screening and counseling for sexually active women*
- **Human Papillomavirus (HPV) DNA Test:** high-risk HPV DNA testing every three years for women with normal cytology results who are 30 or older*
- **Well-Woman Visits** to obtain recommended preventive services for women under 65*

*Note: Most services are free of charge immediately. Services marked with an asterisk (*) must be covered with no cost-sharing in plan years starting on or after August 1, 2012.*
